IIM Shillong organises Lecture on Freedom Movement along with mass recitation of National Anthem to celebrate 70 years of Independence



In sync with the upbeat mood dawning upon the country on the occasion of its 70th year of independence, IIM Shillong extended its commemoration by organizing a Lecture on the Freedom Movement to rekindle the spirit of the freedom struggle and look back at the sacrifices made by our freedom fighters to reach the stage where we are today. The lecture was delivered by **Shri Abhijit Choudhury, ex-lecturer of history at St Edmunds College** in Shillong. He has also contributed articles and essays to a number of books and publications like "Little known fighters Against the Raj" and "Nationalism, Regionalism and Philosophy of National Integration". The event was also presided over by **the Director of the Institute, Dr Amitabha De** and other faculty members and students.

Shri Abhijit Choudhury, while speaking of all the different dimensions of the country's freedom underscored the struggle ranging from the contribution of the North East to the active role played by women in the freedom struggle. He also drew the attention of the audience towards some of the unsung heroes of the Pan-Indian freedom movement, calling upon the youth to ensure that their expectations for India's future are realised.

The Director also added to the spirit of the freedom struggle by saying, "In order to commemorate the great contributions of the many freedom fighters, we need to ensure that the freedom of the human spirit can be preserved and taken forward."

This was followed by a mass recitation of the National anthem by more than 300 students and members of the college in line with the Human Resource Ministry's initiative in schools as part of the 70 years of Independence celebrations.

As the event drew to a close, the students were left with the realisation that freedom comes only after a lot of hurdles and we must not forget all that had to be sacrificed to get here.

IIM Shillong participated in the **Sports and Cultural fest 'Valhalla', held at XLRI** from 29th to 31st of July. IIM Shillong sent a contingent of 25 members to participate in various sports ranging from football, basketball, badminton, table tennis, carrom and chess. This was the 1st sports fest that IIM Shillong participated in. The other participating colleges included XIMB, SIBM (Pune), NMIMS (Mumbai) and IIM Ranchi. The institute achieved huge success in the tournament, ending up with one silver and various bronze medals.

The contingent of 25 sportspeople departed for XLRI on the 28th of July. The journey involved a bus ride to Guwahati, a train ride from Guwahati to Kolkata, and then another train ride from Kolkata to Jamshedpur. The 3 day fest involved many tightly contested matches between the various colleges. In spite of a valiant show put up by the football team from the institute, they were eliminated before the semi-finals. The basketball, table tennis (men and women) and carrom teams performed exceptionally well and secured a bronze medal each. The badminton team won the silver medal and finished a very close second to XLRI.

The contingent departed from XLRI on 31st July and reached IIM Shillong on the 2nd of August. Valhalla was a grand success for the IIM Shillong sports fraternity. This resounding success of the students in only their 1st inter-college sports meet, firmly establishes the IIM Shillong sports teams as a force to be reckoned with.
