### THE PROGRAM

# **PEDAGOGY**

The training program will be facilitated through a combination of lectures, management games, case study exercises, role plays, discussion with practical examples of successful leadership and innovators which will reflect the real-life scenarios and how the faculty members can inculcate pertinent skills. The emphasis is on learning through peer learning, and problem solving.



# **ELIGIBILITY**

Permanent Faculty with a minimum of three years of teaching experience from centrally funded institutes, Institutes of National Importance, as well as UGC and AICTE recognized universities, colleges, standalone institutes, and State Public University.

# **DURATION OF THE PROGRAM**

The Program's duration is for five Days with a minimum of 4 Sessions per day of 90 minutes each. The participants are expected to remain available at IIM Shillong throughout the Program.





# **CERTIFICATE OF COMPLETION**

On completion of the Program the Participants will be awarded with a Certificate of Participation from IIM Shillong.

# PROGRAM FEE STRUCTURE FOR RESIDENTIAL MDP

The program fee is Rs. 50,000 per participant which is fully funded by the Ministry of Education, Govt of India. Institute may nominate upto 2 participants to attend the program. In the case of more than 2 participants nominated by the institutions, the full cost shall be borne by the participant's institutions for those additional participants.

This fee includes academic charges, study material, boarding, and lodging. However, participants/sponsoring institutes are responsible for TA/DA expenses. (The cost of travel (to and from host institution) shall be borne by the participants).
