### Five-Year Integrated Program in Management (IPM) 2026-31 Admissions Process

Admission to the IPM 2026–2031 batch in IIM Shillong shall require candidates to submit the application form along with the prescribed application fee. Subsequently, candidates will be shortlisted for the Personal Interview (PI) process. Upon completion of the PI process, a final merit list will be published based on the candidates' consolidated scores. This list will include both the selected candidates and those placed on the waiting list. The detailed admission process is outlined in the subsequent sections.

#### 1. Eligibility Criteria

Candidates satisfying the following criteria are eligible to apply for the IPM 2026-31 batch:

- Age: A Candidate should have been born on or after August 01, 2006 (5 years of relaxation will be applied to candidates from SC/ST/DA categories, i.e., born on or after August 01, 2001).
- Qualifying Marks and Subject:
  - A Candidate should have a minimum of 70% marks in the Class X/ Secondary School Certificate (SSC) examinations and in Class XII/ Higher Secondary Certificate (HSC) or equivalent examinations (65% for candidates from SC/ST/DA categories),  
AND
  - A Candidate should have studied Mathematics or Applied Mathematics as a subject in Class XI and Class XII.
- Entrance Test: A Candidate should have appeared for the IPM AT 2026 (IPM Aptitude Test) conducted by IIM Indore  
OR  
SAT taken after 1<sup>st</sup> June 2025 (For Overseas Candidates).  
IIM Shillong will consider the Valid IPM AT 2026 or SAT scores for shortlisting candidates for the PI process.

**Note 1:** Candidates who are likely to complete Class XII/HSC or equivalent by the end of July 31, 2026, can also apply, subject to meeting the eligibility criteria mentioned above. If selected, such candidates will be admitted to the IPM on a provisional basis. At the time of registration for the program, such candidates must produce Class X/ SSC and Class XII/ HSC or equivalent examination mark sheets, along with a School-leaving Certificate/Migration Certificate, failing which the candidate's provisional admission offer will stand cancelled.

**Note 2:** IIM Shillong calculates the percentage of marks obtained by a candidate in Class X and Class XII based on the aggregate marks of all subjects that appear in the mark sheet/grade sheet, irrespective of the Board's regulation. If the candidate is awarded letter grades or grade points

instead of marks, the conversion of grades to the percentage of marks shall be made in accordance with the procedure certified by the Board/Competent Authority, which explains the conversion method and the source from which the certificate was obtained.

**Note 3:** Candidates who completed their Class X and/or Class XII / pursuing their Standard XII from international schools affiliated to foreign boards like IGCSE (International General Certificate for Secondary Education) and IB (International Baccalaureate) (participants of IBDP and IBCP only) can also apply, and such candidates are required to produce “The IB Indian Percentage Transcript”.

**Note 4:** IIM Shillong reserves the right to decide the eligibility conditions in terms of equivalence, percentage of marks, and the recognition of the qualifying examination, intake, etc.

## 2. Application Procedure

An eligible candidate should submit the application form online (visit [www.iimshillong.ac.in](http://www.iimshillong.ac.in)) from 1<sup>st</sup> May 2026 to 30<sup>th</sup> May 2026, and pay the application fee of Rs. 2000/- (Rupees Two Thousand only) / Rs. 1000/- (Rupees One Thousand only, for SC/ST/DA/EWS category candidates). This Application fee is non-refundable/non-transferable.

A Candidate belonging to the SC, ST, or DA categories must produce a valid Caste/Category certificate in support of the concerned reserved category. Similarly, a candidate belonging to the Economically Weaker Sections (EWS) must produce a valid document confirming the candidate's eligibility to apply under the EWS category.

A candidate cannot make any changes to the category once the application is finally submitted.

## 3. Selection Procedure

A candidate will be selected based on overall performance in Class X, Class XII, IPM AT 2026/ SAT taken after 1<sup>st</sup> June 2025, and the PI. The selection process is as follows:

**Stage 1:** A Candidate who meets the minimum eligibility criteria mentioned in Section 1 must submit the application online, as outlined above. IIM Shillong reserves the right to request additional information if necessary.

**Stage 2:** In this stage, the eligible pool for Stage 3 (i.e., the PI) is created by considering only candidates with positive raw scores and a minimum mark in each of the three sections of IPM AT 2026 or SAT Categories. The Admissions Committee will decide the minimum cut-off mark in each section. The applicant category will determine the minimum cut-off mark for each section. IIM Shillong will not send individual regret letters to applicants who are rejected at this stage.

**Stage 3:** A sufficient number of candidates will be shortlisted for the PI from the eligible pool for each category (General, EWS, SC, ST, and DA) based on the IPM AT 2026/SAT scores.

**Stage 4:** Shortlisted candidates have to appear for the PI. Only Shortlisted candidates will be invited for the PI. The PI process will be held online.

**Stage 5:** IIM Shillong expects candidates to demonstrate consistent, satisfactory performance across the various parameters of the PI. The Admissions Committee may determine the prescribed minimum performance standards for any of these parameters. Candidates who fail to meet the prescribed minimum performance standards in any of these parameters will not be considered for the subsequent stage of the selection process.

**Stage 6:** Only those candidates who meet the requirements outlined in the preceding stages will be considered for final selection. A category-wise merit list will be prepared based on the Overall Score (OS) as specified in Table 1. Provisional admission offers will be extended accordingly, in compliance with the reservation norms prescribed by the Government of India.

IIM Shillong will not share any information with the candidates who are not finally offered the admission for the IPM.

### **Reservation Policy**

The Institute abides by the reservation policy as per the Government of India provisions as applicable to IIM Shillong.

### **IMPORTANT NOTES**

1. IIM Shillong reserves the right to make changes in the Shortlisting and Selection Criteria, if considered necessary at any point in time.
2. The entire Admission Process is based on the data provided by the IPM AT 2026 Authorities. At any point in time, if the data for any candidate is found to be false/incorrect, the candidature will be cancelled even if the candidate is offered admission by IIM Shillong.
3. Please note that IIM Shillong's shortlisting of candidates for the PI process is independent of those of other IIMs. Hence, it is possible to observe variations in the lists of candidates shortlisted by different IIMs.
4. Shortlisted candidates will be informed via the IIM Shillong website ([www.iimshillong.ac.in](http://www.iimshillong.ac.in)) and e-mail (as provided in the IPM AT 2026 Application form). IIM Shillong will send the PI process call letters only to those shortlisted candidates who correctly filled the Application form within the stipulated time. Communication will be sent only to applicants who are shortlisted for the

PI process.

5. Candidates are advised to keep visiting the IIM Shillong website regularly for updates.
6. The evaluation parameters used during the PI process are the intellectual property of IIM Shillong and will not be shared at any time.
7. Candidates who appear in the PI process can view their admission status in the second week of July 2026 by checking their registered email address and Institutes website.
8. Based on the merit list prepared, candidates will be offered an admission to the program, subject to seat availability. A waitlist will also be maintained, and candidates on it will be offered an admission based on their rank on the list if certain candidates do not accept their admission offers. There may be several iterations of offers extended to the waitlisted candidates. The number of such offers will be determined by available seats, not by any cutoff for the overall score. Thus, no cutoff overall score will be recorded when a shortlist or waitlist is announced.
9. Any dispute concerning Admissions to IPM (2026-31) would be subject to the jurisdiction of the competent courts within the territorial jurisdiction of Shillong.
